July 5th 1945

my Darling Melva,

I hope everything is O.K. with you "Cutie". I surely miss you! Still passing time waiting for assignment. Some of the fellows are getting temporary duty here on a Carrier for training purposes. I hope I can get it next week.

I am going to ask for Saturday off and see if I can look up Mrs. Brady's daughter. I don't know if I can get the time off or not, but there is no harm in trying.

I heard from some of the fellows that I ran across, that Lt. Walworth was out here ever since he left Notre Dame. Just a week or so ago he was finally assigned to a ship in Armed Guard and is out on duty now.

Lt. Stuckey is here in fighter direction. He was the company officer of the "S" in Badin when I was a Midshipman. He has been on Destroyer duty. J. F. Clark was here ^{in Hawaii} for a while, but left before I arrived, so that I didn't get to see him.

That's about all of the familiar faces I have run across so far except I did meet two fellows that were Midshipmen in the same class I was in and remembered me as the Regimental Commander.

The weather here has been fine, just a little on the warm side but not bad at all. Everything looks a little dry as if there hasn't been any rain here for a while.
